Casa Cultural de las Americas (CCA), is an organization whose main purpose is to preserve and promote the cultural diversity of the Americas in the United States and Europe.

It emerged in 2012 as an initiative of Dr. Elizabeth Quila and a group of Hispanic Americans interested in promoting the cultural arts of their heritage.

With this project, we found a niche that presented the cultural plurality of Latin America in the context of an English-speaking country.

Our Vision

One of the organization's main objectives was to become a platform that would showcase the cultural richness of the Americas, with a primary focus on presenting contemporary literature written in Spanish to audiences in the Houston, Texas, other U.S. cities, and later Europe.

To achieve these objectives, a diverse group of volunteers was formed that included people from both Latin American and the U.S. Through lectures, workshops, awarding scholarships, and writing competitions, in addition to the institutionalized International Literature Festival, the select group continues with its mission to promote cultural arts. As a non-profit 501 (c) (3) File Number C.C.A. 46-2586071, the activities of the association are financed through sponsorships and donations, which are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law.

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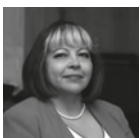
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
